She lives in Laguna Hills with her husband Brad. Her motto is "Fun & Done" and her website is www.sandycquilts.com . Her presentation is titled: "Making Scrappy Quilts Fresh," and her workshop is: "My Basket Collection."

You do not have to wear a costume to join us on Wednesday, Oct 31 at Quilters for Others.



Call for Quilts New Quilts of Southern California 2019

The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds is accepting entries for an exhibit at Road to California, January 23-27, 2019. Exhibit entries are limited to SCCQG members only.

We would like quilts that are new and have not been widely shown – your latest work! The subject matter, techniques, and genre are up to you! Let's see what's emerging from your sewing studio these days! No Kit Quilts will be accepted. This exhibit will be juried by a team.

Entry requirements are as follows (please read carefully):

- Entry(ies) must have been finished in 2017 or 2018 and be in excellent condition.
- Entry forms available at www.sccqg.org and must be postmarked by November 1, 2018.
- Entries must include a stamped, self-addressed business-sized envelope.
- 4x6 (only) color pictures of both the full quilt and a detail (close-up) with the following information on the back of the photo: title of quilt, dimensions (width x height in inches), and your name.
- The entry form must be enclosed and filled out completely.

Show and Tell





























BLOCK PARTY TREES

DUE - NOVEMBER 12, 2018

FABRIC NEEDED: Please remember to use quilt-shop quality, pre-washed fabrics. Please do NOT use Christmas or holiday novelty fabrics.

- 10 -- 3" x 3" assorted medium and dark green patterns for tree branches
- 2 -- 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" light blue solid or reads like a solid for sky
- 4 3" x 3" light blue solid or reads like a solid for sky
- 2 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" beige to medium brown pattern for ground
- 1 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" dark brown pattern for trunk

CONSTRUCTION:

Draw a diagonal line on the backs of seven 3" green squares. Place a lined green square with an unlined green square right sides together. Sew a scant 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. Press open with seam to the dark fabric. Trim excess to make a 2-1/2" square. Repeat two more times to make 6 green/green blocks.

Take the remaining 4 lined green blocks and do the same, this time with the four 3" light blue squares. There will be 8 green/blue blocks.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

Assemble the five rows. It will resemble the diagram and measure 8-1/2" x 10-1/2".
