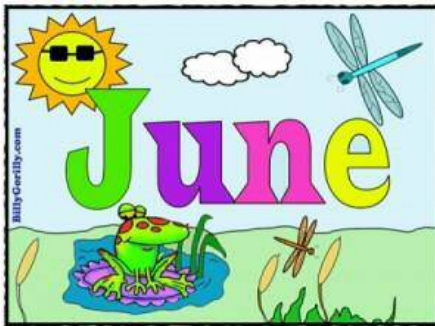

Rita Streimer's background is in Art, especially painting and collage, She has both her B.A. and M.A. in Fine Art and Art Education. Her work in collage eventually led her to fabric, and to quilts, and she has been a quilter and teacher of quilting for over 35 years. She introduced quilting into the L.A. Unified School District's Adult Education program and taught it there for over 20 years. She has also taught at Glendale College and is currently on the staff of the Pierce College Encore program.

From her long experience as a teacher, she will share the methods she uses to build her students' skills and direct them toward finding their own creative paths in the vast world of quilt making. She will explore how she exposes them to a wide range of construction techniques and patterns so that they can make the kinds of quilts that are right for their abilities and personalities and fit into their lifestyles.

**BLOCK PARTY – INDIAN SUMMER**

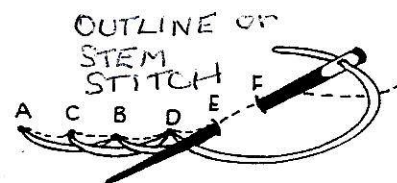

8" finished block is due in June 2019

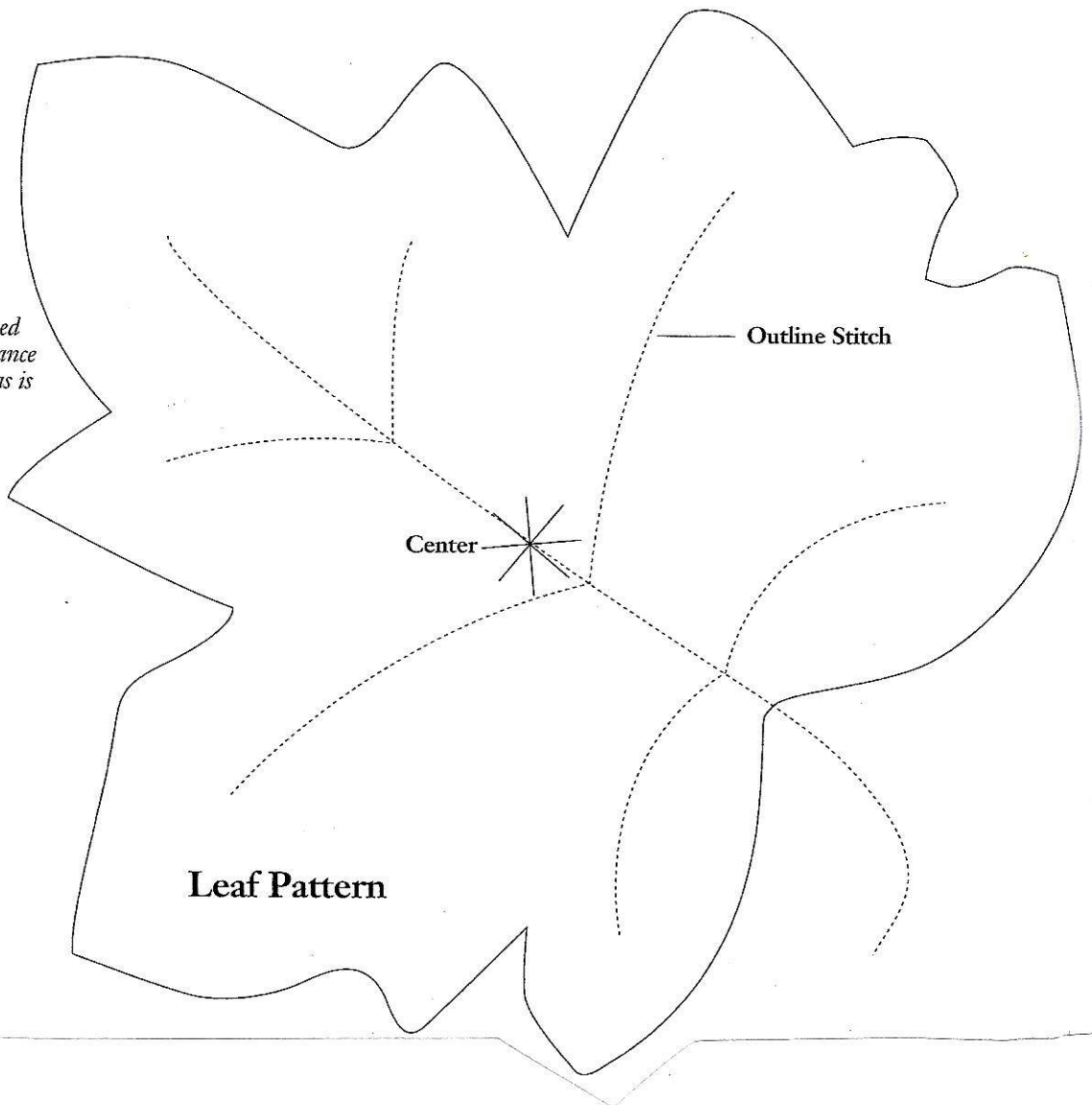
Cut 8 ½" by 8 ½" square in white, solid or white on white cotton

Cut leaf pattern out of green, orange, brown, rust, or yellow small print cotton

Using a light box or window, trace the outline stitch marks on leaf. Find center of white square. Pin leaf to white cotton making sure that the center matches and the leaf points to the upper left. Attach leaf using method of your choice. Embroider the stem and veins in stem (outline) stitch using 2 strands of floss in dark green.



*Appliqué pattern is finished size. Add ¼" seam allowance for hand appliqué or cut as is for machine appliqué.*
